INTRODUCTION

Executive Director Anamaria Antoci, Director of Strategy Edel Brosnan and Director of Programmes Alexia Muiños Ruiz

2022 was the first leap year since the onset of Covid-19 and fittingly, EWA Network hit the ground running. Our online hangouts, masterclasses and seminars went from strength to strength. Campaigning and networking are both entwined in EWA's DNA, and with this in mind, we ran a diverse programme of online and inperson events for our members across the year, while also highlighting the continuing gender gap - and diversity gap in the screen industries. In September, we said goodbye to our outgoing Executive Director Jenni Koski and Strategy and partnership manager **Tamara Tatishvili**, and we thank them for their contribution to EWA's vision of a gender-balanced audiovisual sector in Europe.

Looking at online events, we blew away the January cobwebs with a fireside chat and mixer with Breaking through the lens, **Film Fatales** and **Wscripted**.

In February we shared our full Berlinale programme online, covering topics ranging from sustainable production, pitching documentaries and writing for the screen with WScripted, to the **LGBTQI** experience behind the camera. We followed up with an online session on empowerment and entrepreneurship with **EAVE's** CEO **Tina Trapp** in March, a masterclass on film composition with **Reframe** in April and several sessions across the year on film financing. We brought film theorist and filmmaker Fernanda Rossi to work with EWA members in five sessions on the art and craft of pitching. perfecting loglines, creating pitch decks, as well as writing and editing scenes. We hosted Mo Abudu - described by Forbes as Africa's Most Successful Woman - in a masterclass session and a series of hugely informative sessions on an eclectic range of topics ranging from animation and co-production to contracts

and international sales.

Documentary film was a strong focus for EWA right from the start of 2022: for example, we gave awards to superlative projects at Women Circle Doc Accelerator programme in January and Dok Leipzig in October. EWA attended Sunny Side of the Doc in June, and we were a partner of the Nebulae programme at DocLisboa in October.

Across all audiovisual disciplines in fact, we had a busy year. In the first three months alone, we were present at Trieste, Berlin (for our annual members' event), Thessaloniki (for the launch of our mentoring programme) and Lille, where we co-sponsored the second Woman in Series Award. We also held our **General** Assembly at Lille in March. That same month, we held a live networking event in Vilnius with Lithuanian film industry professionals. In April, we held a screening of "Klondike" in Brussels, to support Ukrainian filmmakers, and in May we flew the flag for gender equality at a roundtable discussion in Madrid, at Reykjavik's RVK Feminist Film Festival, and at Cannes.

In June, we reinforced our presence in Forum Alentours in Strasbourg with a keynote on social protection and a panel on safety and well-being in the workspace. In September, we brought our mentoring programme participants together once again at the Venice Film Festival. In November, our new **Executive Director Anamaria** Antoci spoke out at Thessaloniki about how to maintain mental health and wellbeing in the pressure-cooker environment of the film industry - a hot topic that impacts directly on the exodus of women from our sector. In December, our new Director of Strategy, **Edel Brosnan**, gave the closing remarks to the hybrid online/in person roundtable discussion entitled 'Women in European Cinema - Are We Making **Progress?'** that we co-hosted in Brussels with our partner **Uni-Europa**. This live-streamed event was followed by a private briefing on the gender pay gap. Again, this is a topic that directly affects our members - and women across the screen industries and we intend to return to this topic in 2023. Watch this space!

EWA WHEN EAST MEETS WEST (WEMW) and Circle Awards

EWA Network has been collaborating with **WEMW** since 2017 delivering content to the industry program and presenting an annual award for an outstanding female director.

In this year's program EWA Network presented two awards for female filmmakers and also supported a panel on inclusive filmmaking initiatives and active collaborations on diversity. The panel "Embracing a New and Inclusive Future" included filmmakers and activists representing a wide variety of backgrounds and experiences.

The panelists were filmmaker Iyabo Boyd from Brown Girls Doc Mafia (USA), Europe Council Chair Melanie Hoyes from the Geena Davis Institute on Gender in Media (UK), Program Director and EWA member Biljana Tutorov from Circle Women Doc Accelerator (Serbia), and Producer Tamara Dawit from The Racial Equity Media Collective (Canada). The panel was moderated by DAE co-founder and EWA member Brigid O'Shea.

EWA Network presented two awards to strong projects by female directors.

EWA WEMW AWARD

Traditionally, European Women's
Audiovisual Network has presented the annual award at WEMW Co-Production
Forum to a project which is helmed by a woman director. However, this year the selection was broadened to be more inclusive. The selection criteria included aspects such as the narrative of the story, the representation of the characters, the production team and other facets that widen the idea of what makes us equal and inclusive in this film business.

The 2022 EWA WEMW Award was presented to a debut feature project by a woman director. We were enchanted by the main character, one we rarely see on the silver screen, dealing with obstacles that no girl in that age should face.

With this award **EWA Network** celebrated the expansion of the canon on and about young women and the multifaceted view on what it means to be a woman presented in a fiction film.

The EWA WEMW Award was presented to director Mo Scarpelli for the film <u>"A Song that Slays"</u>



EWA Circle Award

EWA Network has also supported work-in-progress projects in the <u>Circle Women Doc Accelerator</u> training program in the past few years. This year the selection jury was unanimous in their decision to support the winning documentary by a woman director, including a narrative that expands the scope of womankind on screen.

This year the **EWA Circle Award** jury focused on the selection criteria to select a film project that observes feminism and the history of womankind in an excellent and unusual way. The awarded project is a documentary time machine, connecting

feminist discourse of the 1970s and 80s with a new generation of women looking to understand their current-day discomfort and answer some of the ongoing questions about why we still live in a patriarchal world.

The EWA Circle Award was presented to the project <u>"Searching for the Goddess"</u> and its director Lina Lytė Plioplytė and producer Andrėja Čebatavičiūtė.

EWA Network was represented at **WEMW** by Strategy Manager **Tamara Tatishvili**.

EWA NETWORK'S COLLABORATION WITH THE LITHUANIAN FILM INDUSTRY AND MEETING POINT VILNIUS

Thanks to the generous support of the Lithuanian Film Fund, it was very important for EWA Network to team up with Meeting Point Vilnius (MPV). Our partners in the activities in Vilnius were Lithuanian Shorts and Women in Film and Television (WIFT) Lithuania together with Pitch the Doc. At the market, EWA Network organised a networking event, a panel discussion and a joint industry lunch at MPV.

The panel discussion "Communities as a Tool for Change" was very well attended by the market participants and it raised several relevant topics for future collaborations.

In addition, together with our partners we organised a networking event for our communities and an industry lunch to enable professional networking and further community building regionally and internationally.

Finally, the new EWA Endorsed documentary showroom at Pitch the Doc was presented at Meeting Point Vilnius.



CELEBRATING UKRAINIAN CINEMA. SCREENING OF KLONDIKE

EWA's response to the war in Ukraine resulted in different support actions undertaken towards Ukrainian professionals. As one of those undertakings, the Network partnered with EFAD for the proposed event and cohosted a special screening of "KLONDIKE" a Ukrainian Turkish co-production directed by Maryna Er Gorbach. The event was further supported by EFA, EPC, FERA, SAA and UNIC. The screening served as an occasion to celebrate Ukrainian cinema and discuss how to support the film community in Ukraine. It was organized in Cinema Galeries (Galerie de la Reine) and hosted by Tamara Tatishvili, EWA's Strategy Consultant who also engaged in an emotional conversation with Maryna Er Gorbach and Mehmed Er.

"KLONDIKE" tells the story of a Ukrainian family living on the border of Russia and Ukraine during the start of the war. Irka refuses to leave her house even as the village is captured by armed forces.



EWA NETWORK'S HANGOUT WITH WRITERS LAB EUROPE

EWA Network invited the co-founders of The Writers Lab for a casual, candid conversation about how to workshop an idea, alone and in community, and by using script development labs. Elizabeth Kaiden and Nitza Wilon answered our members' questions about preparing a screenplay to submit (and top reasons scripts are NOT selected); about the types of content and genres; about screenwriting craft and markets for screenplays; and about how to approach script development generally. The session is ideally suitable for writers of any kind and creative producers interested in story development. The event was attended by about 30 EWA Network members.

This workshop presented the main international co production funds available either regional, national or international and some of the best practices to ensure a strong application.

Beatriz Aparicio, Deputy of Equity Observatory of the Spanish Radio and TV consortium moderated the table.

TRAINING: FIVE SEMINARS WITH FERNANDA ROSSI

SEMINARS: CLINIC FOR PITCH, LOGLINE, DOSSIER AND KEY SCENES WITH **FERNANDA ROSSI**

EWA Network teamed up with **Fernanda** Rossi, writer, film theorist and director in five unique seminars and case studies for EWA members. The programme was designed to entirely take place on-line. In five practical meetings for **EWA** members only, we explored innovative tools using the principles of semiotics to improve your work. Whether it's a pitch, logline, dossier or scene (written or already shot and edited) you can practice in real time how to transform your materials from merely good to really great. Each session used case studies as guidance and the participants can follow along applying the techniques on their own work and ask questions.

Fernanda Rossi is a renowned film theorist and speaker who has given her signature workshops and lectures in more than 15 countries for over 40 film organizations. She has also been a trainer for special mid-career programs such as Doc Campus and ESoDoc.



EWA NETWORK AT CANNES FILM FESTIVAL

In 2022 EWA Network had a strong presence in Cannes. We organised the traditional cocktail event with high representation of partners, members and other film festival goers. In addition to the traditional program, EWA Network was privileged to have access to the Cannes Marché du Film Co-Production Night, where we had a large delegation of talented filmmakers among 400 production experts. The Co-Production **Night** was the perfect event to match up with potential co-producers and catch up with representatives of the most important international co-production markets who will facilitate the matchmaking.

Executive Director Jenni Koski was also a guest of honour at the Producers Network breakfast meeting during the Cannes Film Festival. It was a great opportunity to talk about the work on gender equality and inclusion in the European film industry with several young generation producers eager to create change.

Furthermore, EWA Network partnered with the Marché du Film's new program titled impACT Lab, presented for the first time during Cannes Film Festival 2022.

The ImpACT Lab was designed specifically to help emerging producers develop essential skills needed for the ideal positioning of their projects in the global marketplace. Tamara Tatishvili, Strategy Manager of EWA Network, acted as one of the ImpACT Lab experts helping selected participants explore funding landscapes of European coproductions as well as some trends of enhanced international cooperation in the AV sector.

As an official partner of Marche's Co-Production Day, EWA Network also cohosted the Co-Pro Party gathering all participating producers and EWA Network members for a fun night full of networking opportunities.



Lastly, we were proud to <u>highlight the presence of EWA Network</u> members, specially the success story of PAMFIR, a project boosted in our mentoring programme in the festival and the presence of two EWA members in the <u>WScripted Cannes Screenplay list</u>



EWA NETWORK SUPPORTED EUROPE! VOICES OF WOMEN IN FILM

For the third year in a row, **EWA Network** continued its cooperation with **European Film Promotion** programme, **Europe! Voices of Women in Film**, proposed in partnership with **Sydney Film Festival** and with the support of **Creative Europe MEDIA** and **Eurimages**.

A special online meeting was organized with all selected female talent and offered safe space for the directors to unpack their views on the issues shaping gender equality agenda in Europe and internationally. **Tamara Tatishvili** hosted this talk, presenting filmmakers from 10 different countries and demonstrating diverse artistic talent.

A MASTERCLASS WITH MO ABUDU

EWA Network proudly hosted an e-masterclass with Mo Abudu, the Series Mania Woman in Series Award winner and Ebony Films CEO. Chaired by Tamara Tatishvili, the talk shedd lots of light on the career path of Mo Abudu, creating special and inspiring momentum for EWA's members.

Mo has made her mark through various endeavors in the corporate world; she has been described by Forbes as "Africa's Most Successful Woman". Abudu oversees all the divisions of the EbonyLife Group which include EbonyLife Media, comprising EbonyLife Films and EbonyLife Studios, as well as the EbonyLife Creative Academy, a school aimed at accelerating filmmaking skills, and EbonyLife Place, Nigeria's first luxury entertainment resort.

EWA Network, alongside Séries Mania & Pour les femmes dans les Médias (PFDM) awarded Mo with the second annual Woman in Series Award in March 2022 to recognise her work and many notable achievements throughout her career. In her masterclass Mo shared insights into her career, barriers she had to overcome and the strategic vision of EbonyLife Group and interacted naturally with members.

EWA Network at Sunny Side of the Doc

EWA Network was invited to join **Sunny Side of the Doc** as an expert in the film industry to meet and liaise with filmmakers. In addition, we organised a network talk "**The Power of Networking**" and industry cocktail event together with our partner communities **DAE**, **Pitch the Doc**, **B2B Doc** and the **Institute of Documentary Film**.

FORUM ALENTOURS

EWA Network organised a seminar titled "Gender equality and workplace safety – Where are we now?" at Forum Alentours.

Post **#Metoo** and **Covid-19** pandemic, cultural and creative sectors are still dealing with social protection issues, with more violence and harassment coming to light across all sectors. EWA Network hosted a keynote and a panel with experts who discussed social protection in our industry. The keynote was hosted by **Ms Margherita Licata** and in the panel we explored the situation in France and Finland with experts **Nora Philippe** from **Eurodoc** and **Tarja Savolainen** from **WIFT Finland.**

EWA BOARD AGREES NEW STRATEGY FOR 2023-25

The Executive Team presented to the board EWA's strategy for 2023-2025, focusing on the gender pay gap, the different needs and priorities of women from marginalised groups working in the screen industries, and the importance of safety, wellbeing at work, both in front of and behind the camera. The board adopted the new strategy, and agreed that it should be shared with members and partners in the new year.

Hang out with IDM Film Commission Südtirol: The RACCONTI Lab

On November 14th, the team of Südtirol Film Commission presented their programme RACCONTI | IDM Script Lab to EWA members. RACCONTI is an annual exclusive script-writing laboratory, designed to develop only three feature film projects with a high production potential. EWA Network is delighted to host Rernate Ranzi and Barbara Weithaler from IDM Film Commission Südtirol to present their scriptwriting Lab RACCONTI and to encourage writers/directors to apply.

Torino Female Voices Award

EWA Network partnered with **Torino Film Lab** to present an award to a project in development penned by a female writer.

EWA Network Director of Programmes, **Alexia Muiños Ruiz**, addressed to the industry audience at **Torino Film Meeting**, mentioning the pay gap female authors suffer and the lesser representation of women (only 25% of the film writers are female). **Kosovar Doruntina Basha** with *BLEACH*, won the first **EWA Network Female Voices Award** at **TFL**.

<u>PANEL:</u> "Women in European Cinema: Are We Making Progress?

On 7th December, **EWA Network** and **UNI Europa - Media Entertainment** and **Arts** (EUROMEI) and the **European Film Agency Directors Association** (EFAD) organised and held the third annual "Women in European Cinema: Are We Making Progress?" online panel. The event also featured partners the <u>International Federation of Actors (FIA)</u>, the <u>Federation of European Screen Directors (FERA)</u>, the <u>Lab Femmes de Cinema</u>, the <u>European Audiovisual Observatory</u> and Cineuropa.

For the third consecutive year (see 2021 and 2020 events <u>here</u> and <u>here</u>), the event provided an invaluable update on the gender gap in European cinema, with a view to keeping the topic on the policy agenda, monitoring progress and identifying priority actions for the future.

The meeting started with a presentation of the most recent gender-equality statistics from the European Audiovisual Observatory, by Patrizia Simone. According to data from the years 2017-2021 (both inclusive), women represented only 25% of all European feature directors, compared to 75% for men; for screenwriters, women account for 28%, 34% for producers, 39% for lead roles, 10% for composers and 10% for cinematographers. Although the percentage of women in the ranks of active professionals is growing, progress is slow, and women are still underrepresented. Women worked on a smaller number of films than men and that there is a disparity when it comes to the productions' budgets. You can read the report in full by clicking here.

During the second panel, Fabienne
Silvestre, co-founder of the Lab Femmes
de Cinéma, and overall coordinator Lise
Perottet presented an overview of good
practices on a European level.

Edel Brosnan, EWA's Director of Strategy made the closing remarks for the online panel, noting the importance of capturing the reality of work in the screen industries for women through data, as a tool to help drive policy change, and giving as an example the positive impact that Eurimages' gender monitoring has had in striving for a better gender balance in terms of projects funded. In summary, we are making slow progress and there is still much work to be done but we are nevertheless heading in the right direction.

After the public event, the organizers and partners held a roundtable discussion about the gender pay gap in the screen industries and discussed practical measures for closing the gap.

Mentoring Seminar: The human side of Co-Production Stories. Communicating with Impact

EWA Network finished the year with the working sessions in the **Mentoring Programme**. This session consisted of a workshop, a follow up of **CO-PRODUCTION STORIES: The Human Side** - Communication with impact, meant to be a safe space to discuss and perfect the art of communication when navigating cultural differences. **Bonnie Williams**, was the facilitator in this interactive seminar about the way we communicate considering the cultural differences.

This workshop was followed by a group meeting over the following week.

EWA DEVELOPMENT AWARDS

EWA Network's Awards at When East Meets West 2022

EWA Network has been collaborating with WEMW since 2017 delivering content to the industry program and presenting an annual award for a female director. However, this year the selection was broadened to be more inclusive. The selection criteria included aspects such as the narrative of the story, the representation of the characters, the production team and other facets that widen the idea of what makes us equal and inclusive in this film business.

The 2022 EWA WEMW Award was presented to a debut feature project with a main character we rarely see on the silver screen, dealing with obstacles that no girl in that age should face. With this award EWA Network celebrates the expansion of the canon on and about young women and the multifaceted view on womanity presented in a fiction film.

The EWA WEMW Award was presented to director Mo Scarpelli and the film <u>A Song</u> that Slays.



EWA Network has also supported work-in-progress projects in the <u>Circle Women Doc</u>

<u>Accelerator</u> training program in the past years. This year the selection jury was unanimous in their decision to support the documentary by a woman director, including a narrative that expands the scope of womankind on screen. **EWA Circle Award** was presented to the project <u>Searching for the Goddess</u> and its director <u>Lina Lytė Plioplytė</u> and producer <u>Andrėja</u> Čebatavičiūtė.

Woman in Series Award in Series Mania

On the International Women's Day, Series Mania and Series Mania Forum in association with European Women's Audiovisual Network (EWA Network) and Pour Les Femmes Dans Les Médias (PFDM), awarded an outstanding woman in the audiovisual industry to honor her vision and leadership. This year's recipient of Woman in Series Award was Mo Abudu, CEO of EbonyLife Group.

From the outset, the mission with the **Woman** in **Series Award** has been to increase the visibility of female producers and projects. The Award was launched in 2021.

FOLLOW-UP of PROJECTS SUPPORTED BY EWA

RELEASED in 2022

Aurora's Sunrise by Inna Sahakyan premiered in Festival de Annecy and was the Armenian candidate for the Oscars. Aurora's Sunrise was awarded in Fest Forward in Belgrade in 2019.

Pink Moon by Floor van der Meulen formerly known as Methusalem. The project received EWA Network's Award in WEMW 2019 and finally premiered in Tribeca 2022 winning Best New Narrative Director -Special Jury Mention. Released in September.

Silent Land by Aga Woszczyńska (formerly known as Fortnight was released in 2021 and it has become a case study for Green SHOOTING.

IN PRODUCTION

The Little loves by Celia Rico, who took the EWA Network Scripwriters' Residency 2020, was shot in July 2022. The film is an international coproduction between Spanish Arcadia Motion Pictures and French Noodles Production.

We are Inside by Farah Kassem is still in postproduction, after retakes and editing of the rough cut.

Ever Since I knew Myself by Maka Gogaladze, awarded in DOK Leipzig 2020. The DOCUMENTARY project was selected to Change Workshop, organized by EAVE, IMS and CPH:DOX and was presented at CPH:DOX industrial program by the end of March 2022 and received the Alpha Panda Award at Cannes DOC.

IN DEVELOPMENT

A winner is seen at the start by Zhannat Alshanova (KZ). Winner of the EWA Network Award in WEMW 2021. It was selected for several development programs such as TIFF Filmmakers Lab and ACE. On the funding side, after HBF, they received CNC production fund, Sud Region development and plan to shoot in 2023

The Woman Who Poked the Leopard by Patience Nitumwesiga. The project is now a co production between Kenya and Germany, with EWA member Natalia Imaz involved as coproducer.

A SUCCESS STORY

Pamfir, a success story of the EWA Network Mentoring Programme, nominated to the European Discovery Prize

The film produced by Aleksandra Kostina, co-produced by Laura Briand and directed by Dmytro Sukholytkyy-Sobchuk, premiered in Festival de Cannes, directors' fortnight.

We are particularly proud of this film which was developed during the **Mentoring Programme** for emerging producers, where **Kostina** and **Briand** met, as emerging producer and mentor.

COMMUNICATION

Over the year, 55 original posts were published on our website dealing with members' news, EWA's news and relevant announcements.

In addition, 25 events were announced on our website.

MAILSHOTS

Twenty-two mailshots were sent out to members and newsletter subscribers with articles about **EWA's** activities, calls for applications and relevant news about women in the film industry. 52.8% (1049 people) was the peak of opens in the mailing sent to our community of subscribers.

In addition, **EWA Network** members received thirty-eight mails, including the introduction of new members.

We can conclude that we have a steady audience, more than 60% of the members reading our mailings with a maximum of 69% which means a slight increase from last year.
